Job Overview

This is a full-time on-site role for a Research Technician at Greyter Water Systems, Inc. in Burlington, ON. The Research Technician will work alongside the engineering department in the creation of prototypes, conducting of technical experiments, and field analysis work to support continued development of Greyter's treatment technologies for residential and commercial applications.

Responsibilities

- Assist with testing plan creation; seeing-through implementation of test plan and associated data collection
- Creating summary reports and presenting findings and recommendations to technical staff
- Conduct field visits as required to collect water samples
- Supporting literature review as directed by the engineering department
- Delivering testing materials to third-party laboratories for assessments as well as using testing equipment to conduct water analysis in-house
- Adherence to safety protocols; ensuring testing areas are always kept organized and clean

- Bachelor's degree in a relevant field (e.g. Chemistry, Mechanical Eng., Materials Science, Environmental)
- 3-5 years of experience in a similar role
- Excellent communication skills; able to present findings clearly and concisely through written reports and oral presentations
